Chief Douglas Roberts Missouri S&T



S&T Police Chief Roberts will discuss the investigation of financial crimes that have a cyber nexus including network intrusions and skimming and re-encoding. Chief Roberts will also discuss the transition from the role of a supervisor with the United States Secret Service to that of a Police Chief on the S&T campus. Chief Roberts will discuss the use of emerging technology as used by campus community law enforcement.

Bio: Doug Roberts is the current Chief of Police for Missouri S&T. He joined the University Police Department in June, 2016 after retiring (over 25 years) from the United States Secret Service. While with the Secret Service, Chief Roberts served as the Assistant Agent in Charge of the St. Louis Field Office. In the Secret Service, Chief Roberts supervised the investigative and protective mission for the St. Louis District while also managing the Gateway Electronic Crimes and Financial Crimes Task Force. Chief Roberts is a past instructor on the topics of electronic crimes investigations, financial crimes investigations, and protection techniques, at the International Law Enforcement Academy in Hungary. Chief Roberts has a master's degree from the University of Central Missouri in the Administration of Criminal Justice.
